

Schizophrenia and the psychic mechanism

A few nights ago, I tuned to one of those news shows like 20/20 or Dateline, which featured several little girls suffering from varying types of schizophrenia. One of the girls, whose name is January, I had seen featured on another show. Most of her hallucinations involve animals and numbers. Most commonly, "Wednesday the Rat" and "400 the Cat."

My husband walked into the room partway through, after the explanation of her symptoms had happened, as they were showing her basically talking to the air and some of the other things she does. My husband then asked me if it looked familiar to me. Somewhat horrified, and trying to figure out exactly what he could be implying, I looked at my husband and explained that this little girl was schizophrenic, not psychic.

But it made me think--what if she is in some way psychic?

She certainly displayed some more extreme versions of some of the things that I did as a child (still sometimes do) and I see my daughter do now. Staring off into space at seemingly nothing, talking to things that *weren't there*, etc.

It made me think: what if schizophrenia is just the mechanism that makes some of us psychic broken and going haywire?

Most psychics can pick up on human spirits and sometimes the spirits of domesticated animals. The last ghost I saw with my eyes was actually the ghost of a mouse running through my living room. A mouse my cats had killed last Halloween. Probably the one time I'd ever felt woozy after seeing a ghost--I'm so afraid of mice.

I can't speak for all schizophrenics or all types of schizophrenia. But I do wonder what would happen if a psychic and January were in the room together, what the psychic would be able to pick up from her.

I have a family member who has been diagnosed and rediagnosed with many conditions during his life. His is only 21, but has been labeled high functioning autistic, bipolar, ADD, paranoid schizophrenic, and probably more. He has been medicated at one time or another for all of these labels since the age of about 8. If one medication doesn't work...they just change his diagnosis. I feel it is more than even the Dr's understand. No disrespect intended if any of you are in the medical community.

He has serious anti-social behavior, says he hears voices that instruct him to do many things one of which is to kill, experiences fits of violence, and withdraws completely for days at a time. He has experienced physical effects as well such as massive weight losses, drawn face, dark circles under his eyes, wringing of hands constantly, etc.

Luckily he has never hurt anyone, but I fear for his safety, his future and the safety of the family members that act as care-givers to him.

I have been working with him lately and we seem to be getting him to redirect those powerful emotions and urges into more creative outlets. I have been sending healing energy to him as well to help balance. He seems a bit more involved and content, but I feel his condition may be more complex than what I am equipped to repair.

Does anyone have any thought on what I can do or suggest to help him?

I have often wondered throughout his life if he were not sick at all, but possessed. Wondering if he was in torment from a malicious entity. The criteria just fits so perfectly. Anyone have thoughts on that?
