I can tell, probably one of the best horror books that exist. All events are recounted in this volume are true, which makes it even more shocking if possible. Kath and George Lutz began the exhausting and often painful task of rebuilding on tape twenty-eight days they lived in the house of Amityville. Many of his prints, and reports were corroborated by the statement of impartial witnesses, such as Father Mancuso and several local police officers. But perhaps the most dramatic evidence, though circumstantial, to be true, is this: It takes more than an excess of imagination or "nerves" to encourage a sensible family of five members to take such a drastic step as abandoning a magnificent three-storey house, plus a full basement, a pool and a pier, without taking even their personal belongings.
